

EUROPEAN CUP WINTER THROWING

1001. PROMOTION AND RIGHTS

- 1001.1. The European Athletic Association (hereinafter European Athletics) shall promote a European Cup Winter Throwing every year.
- 1001.2. All rights in and arising from the European Cup Winter Throwing are the exclusive property of European Athletics. These rights include but are not limited to rights of ownership, marketing, advertising, broadcasting, filming, televising and all or any other means of exploitation. No other entity may exercise any of these rights without the written consent of European Athletics.

1002. PROGRAMME, STRUCTURE AND SCORING

- 1002.1. The European Cup Winter Throwing shall be staged on (normally) 2 (two) days and in accordance with the applicable Competition, Advertising, Doping and other relevant Rules and Regulations of the International Association of Athletics Federations (IAAF). IAAF Rule 180.5 (determining the order of competition) shall apply.
- 1002.2. The programme shall comprise the following events:
- Senior Men and Women: Shot Put; Discus Throw; Hammer Throw; Javelin Throw.
Under 23 Men and Women: Shot Put; Discus Throw; Hammer Throw; Javelin Throw.
- 1002.3. The European Cup Winter Throwing comprises separate events for men's and women's teams representing European Athletics Member Federations. Each event may, according to the numbers entered, be divided into 2 (two) or more groups considering as much information as possible about the performances of all athletes so that, normally, the best performers compete in the same group. In principle the distribution will be based on the best performances of the athletes since 1 January in the year preceding the date of the competition. Personal best performance and medals achieved at major events can be also considered by the Technical Delegate for the purpose of the distribution per groups. The final distribution is under the discretion of the Technical Delegate. In any case all participating athletes have the right to 6 (six) attempts, and the participation order for each event shall follow the same criteria of the groupings composition in a way that the best ranked athlete throws in the last position.
- 1002.4. European Athletics Member Federations not entering teams may enter athletes to compete as individuals, each event being considered separately.
- 1002.5. All European Athletics Members Federations in good standing shall be entitled to participate in the European Athletics Cup of Winter Throwing.
- 1002.6. No athlete may take part in the European Cup Winter Throwing unless entered by the European Athletics Member Federation which he/she is eligible to represent in accordance with the IAAF Rules.
- 1002.6.1 Except in the Shot Put (men) and Hammer Throw (men), only athletes aged at least 16 (sixteen) years on 31 December of the year of the competition may participate in the European Cup Winter Throwing.

Each athlete may only be entered in one age group of an event at the European Cup Winter Throwing and he/she can only compete in the age group for which he/she was entered. For the avoidance of doubt an athlete can be entered in different age group in different events, but cannot compete in the same event in two age groups.

- 1002.6.2 Only athletes aged at least 18 (eighteen) years on 31 December of the year of the competition may participate in the Shot Put and Hammer Throw (men).
- 1002.6.3 Only athletes aged at least 16 (sixteen) and not more than 22 (twenty two) years on 31 December of the year of the competition may participate in the Under 23 events.
- 1002.7. Each team shall consist of up to 3 (three) athletes entered in each event for Senior Men and Senior Women of which a maximum of 2 (two) may participate and 2 (two) athletes in each event for Under 23 Men and Women of which a maximum of 1 (one) may participate.
- 1002.8. The finishing positions of the men's and women's teams shall be determined separately.
- 1002.9. The finishing positions of the Senior and Under 23 teams shall be determined separately.
- 1002.10. Each team's score shall be determined according to the best performance of its highest finishing athlete in each event and shall be the aggregate of points attributed to those performances according to the International Scoring Tables. The team achieving the highest number of points shall be the winner, and so on.
- 1002.11. If two or more teams have an equality of scores calculated according to 1002.10, the tie shall be decided in favour of the team containing the athlete achieving the highest individual score from a single event. If the tie remains the second highest individual score will be considered and so on.
- 1002.12. Any team finishing without a scoring athlete in all 4 (four) events shall not be counted in the teams classification.
- 1002.13. The points attributable to the best performance of each athlete in each event shall be combined into individual athletes' classification list(s).
- 1002.14. The European Athletics Council shall be entitled to amend or vary the above procedures if it is of the opinion that it is in the interests of the European Cup Winter Throwing.

1003. ENTRIES AND CONFIRMATION

- 1003.1. Each European Athletics Member Federation may enter one team or, alternatively, individuals.
- 1003.2. Preliminary Entries: Not later than 3 (three) months before the date of the European Cup Winter Throwing, each European Athletics Member Federation shall send to European Athletics (usually via the teams' on-line entry system) a preliminary list of athletes and the numbers of accompanying officials.
- 1003.3. Final Entries: Not later than 10 (ten) days before the date of the European Cup Winter Throwing, each European Athletics Member Federation shall send to

European Athletics a final list of its athletes, plus the names of accompanying officials. Final Entry information shall be supplied in the manner to be prescribed by European Athletics (usually via the teams' on-line entry system) and shall include such details as required by European Athletics, including the names and best performances of each athlete.

- 1003.4. Final Declarations: Confirmation of the Final Declaration of athletes to compete shall be made according to the procedures defined in the Team Manual.

1004. APPLICATIONS TO STAGE THE EUROPEAN CUP WINTER THROWING

- 1004.1. Any European Athletics Member Federation may apply to stage a European Cup Winter Throwing match provided that the proposed venue and city comply with the criteria established by European Athletics.

Prior to making the formal application, each potential bidder shall participate in the long term planning by indicating the interest in the annual questionnaire signed by the Member Federation President & General Secretary

European Athletics shall be entitled not to accept any unrealistic announcement or if it was not indicated in the long term planning questionnaire.

- 1004.2. Each applicant shall complete the European Athletics official application forms and supply such information and undertakings as European Athletics shall require. The applications shall be completed in English and any application that is not fully and properly completed may be regarded as invalid.
- 1004.3. The European Athletics Council shall announce the time- and deadlines for applications and these shall normally include:
- i. Indication of interest in questionnaire of long term planning by 30 November, 3 (three) years before the year of the European Cup Winter Throwing which is the deadline to be considered as a candidate for bidding.
 - ii. Confirmation of candidature to apply, with the name of the bid city, to be made by 30 September, 2 (two) years before the year of the European Cup Winter Throwing. The candidature form must be signed by the Member Federation and City.
 - iii. Formal application to be submitted within 2 (two) months of ii.
 - iv. Decision of the European Athletics Council within 6 (six) months of ii.
- 1004.4. The written undertakings required to be submitted with the application shall normally include:
- i. The bidding European Athletics Member Federation's undertaking to respect the applicable Rules and Regulations of the IAAF, European Athletics and other competent authorities and to enter into an organising contract with European Athletics.
 - ii. A guarantee(s) from the owner(s) that all official sites used for the event, including the competition venue shall be free of all commercial and non commercial advertising, identifications and/or franchises.
 - iii. A letter of intent by a television broadcaster of the bidders' country to act as host broadcaster in accordance with the requirements of European Athletics.

- iv. The undertakings in writing of relevant national, regional and other authorities that they support the application.
- v. A detailed budget of income and expenditure for the event.

1004.5. The European Athletics Council shall be entitled to amend or vary the above procedures if it is of the opinion that it is in the interests of the European Cup Winter Throwing.

1005. TECHNICAL REQUIREMENTS OF THE VENUE

1005.1. The European Cup Winter Throwing shall be staged in a venue and city which are appropriate to the event. European Athletics may establish criteria by which the suitability of a proposed venue may be decided. The city shall be of an appropriate size and standing and the competition venue shall have modern facilities and be fully equipped in conformity with the respective IAAF rules.

1005.2. The organiser shall be responsible for the provision of Electronic Distance Measurement for all events,

1006. DOPING CONTROL

1006.1. Doping control shall be conducted in accordance with the respective IAAF Rules and Guidelines and shall be carried out under the supervision of the European Athletics Doping Control Delegate.

1007. THE ORGANISING CONTRACT

1007.1. Immediately after the decision of the European Athletics Council to appoint an organiser, the appointed European Athletics Member Federation shall enter into an organising contract with European Athletics, such contract to establish the respective rights and obligations of the parties in relation to the European Cup Winter Throwing.

1008. THE RIGHTS AND DUTIES OF THE EUROPEAN ATHLETICS

1008.1. Notwithstanding the organising contract, European Athletics shall retain the overall care and responsibility of the European Cup Winter Throwing. In exercise of this role, the European Athletics Council shall:

1008.1.1. Decide the dates, venue and the organiser.

1008.1.2. Appoint Delegates and other persons (see 1011.3).

1008.1.3. Approve the procedure for deciding the timetable of events.

1009. THE RESPONSIBILITIES OF THE ORGANISER

1009.1. The organiser shall be responsible for organising and staging the European Cup Winter Throwing in accordance with the organising contract and in compliance with the Rules and Regulations and directions of European Athletics.

1010. FINANCIAL REGULATIONS

The Organiser

1010.1. The financial rights and obligations of the organiser shall be set out in the organising contract. Subject thereto, the organiser shall be responsible for all costs of organising and staging the European Cup Winter Throwing but may retain the income from the sale of admission tickets, approved television and marketing rights, subventions and grants from national and/or local authorities.

1010.2 For the avoidance of doubt, the organiser shall be responsible for the costs of the following persons:

Delegates appointed by European Athletics (see 1011.3) (except for the Council Delegate); travel, accommodation and board at the event and accommodation and board at the site visits.

Staff and representatives of European Athletics specialist contractors and sponsors; according to the respective contracts.

European Athletics

1010.3. European Athletics shall not be responsible for any costs other than those referred to in these regulations and/or the organising contract.

1010.4. European Athletics may pay to the organiser a contribution to the costs of up to 3 (three) days' accommodation and board of participating teams as follows:

1010.4.1 In respect of Senior Men's and Senior women's teams, 4 (four) athletes, subject to a maximum of 1 (one) athlete per event;

1010.4.2 In respect of Under 23 Men's and Women's teams, 4 (four) athletes, subject to a maximum of 1 (one) athlete per event;

1010.4.3 No contribution shall be made in respect of the teams representing the host European Athletics Member Federation.

1010.5. European Athletics shall be responsible for all direct laboratory costs connected with the doping control including laboratory costs for tests requested for World or Area Records but excluding tests specifically requested by Member Federations.

1010.6. European Athletics shall be responsible for the travelling costs of Delegates appointed by European Athletics at the sites visits prior to the event and staff members travelling costs, accommodation and board when visiting the venue.

The Participating European Athletics Member Federations

1010.7. European Athletics Member Federations shall be responsible for all costs (including travelling to and from the venue) incurred as a result of their participation in the European Cup Winter Throwing which exceed any contributions made by or through the European Athletics in accordance with 1010.4 above.

1010.8. The final account for accommodation attributable to each Member Federation shall be based on the numbers declared in the Final Entries and this shall be paid in full, no allowance being made for subsequent any reduction in the actual numbers of athletes and/or officials.

1010.9. Any European Athletics Member Federation which, having agreed to participate with a team, withdraws and does not inform European Athletics and the organiser at least 30 (thirty) days before the first day of the European Cup Winter Throwing, shall pay to European Athletics as compensation for irrecoverable costs 10000 (ten thousand) Swiss Francs in respect of each team so withdrawn. European Athletics may remit this amount to the organiser.

1010.10. European Athletics Member Federations are responsible for taking out their own insurance to cover illness or injury to any member of their party when travelling to and from and during the European Cup Winter Throwing.

1011. THE EUROPEAN ATHLETICS OFFICIATING PERSONS

1011.1. The President and Director General of European Athletics or their representative(s) shall have the overall responsibility for the care and supervision of the European Cup Winter Throwing.

1011.2. European Athletics shall designate a member of its professional staff to be the Project Leader having the responsibility to coordinate the European Athletics Officiating Persons and other staff members and to direct the operational management of the event in cooperation with the organiser.

1011.3. The European Athletics Council shall appoint the following Delegates and other persons to provide specialist advice and guidance to the organiser:

- 1 Council Delegate;
- 1 Technical Delegate;
- 1 Doping Control Delegate;
- 3 Jury of Appeal Members (together with a fourth replacement to be appointed at the Technical Meeting).

1011.4. As soon as possible after the decision to appoint an organiser European Athletics shall inform the organiser as to the names and roles of the European Athletics Officiating Persons and the organiser shall cooperate with and follow the reasonable and proper directions of such persons.

1012. PROTOCOL, CEREMONIES, AWARDS

1012.1. All matters concerning protocol, ceremonies, awards and related matters shall be decided by European Athletics which may, from time to time, establish guidelines.

Opening and Closing and Victory Ceremonies:

1012.2. Subject to 1012.1, the organiser shall propose opening and closing and victory ceremonies of styles and content appropriate to the venue. These may include ceremonies and/or celebrations held either inside or outside the competition venue. Such proposals shall be subject to the approval of European Athletics and shall be appropriate to a European Cup Winter Throwing.

1012.3. **Victory Ceremonies:**

1012.3.1. The individual winner, second placed and third placed in each event shall each receive a medal to be provided by the organiser.

1012.3.2. The winning team in each event shall receive and retain a cup to be provided by European Athletics. The second and third teams shall each receive a trophy to be provided by European Athletics.

1012.3.3. For the winning, second and third teams, the scoring members as well as non scoring members who completed the competition shall receive medals to be provided by the organiser.

Commemorative Souvenirs:

1012.4. The organiser shall present all participating athletes and officials with a suitable commemorative souvenir.

1013. INFORMATION, NAMES AND ABBREVIATIONS

1013.1. All information shall be printed, displayed or announced in English.

1013.2. The names and abbreviations of all European Athletics Member Federations shall, at all times, conform to those approved and decided by the IAAF.

1014. FINAL PROVISIONS

1014.1. All matters not provided for by these Regulations shall be decided by the European Athletics Council.

1014.2. These Regulations are drawn up in English.

1014.3. These Regulations may be amended by the European Athletics Council.
